WHARE KARAKIA O MANAKO:

A house of prayerfulness for Kerikeri – Manako being the old name for Kerikeri. It is also the word used by missionary and Māori Bible translators here in the North for “welcome”.

Jesus said:

“Ki te manako tētahi ki tētahi tamaiti nohinohi pēnei, he whakaaro hoki ki tōku ingoa, e manako ana ki ahau.”

“Whoever welcomes such a little one as these in my name, welcomes me.”

Matthew 18:5

Toi Te Rito Maihi’s design signifies this as space for the diverse, often fragmented or divisive, strands of the Kerikeri Community to be woven together in strong relationships.

The cross as symbol of self-giving is the means of weaving us together. With firmly woven threads and loosely connected threads all important to the image, the message is that all are welcome and can link as loosely or tightly as they choose.

KAITIAKI

(Guardian)

The Kerikeri Union Church is the group that is at this building's heart, sustaining vision and values sourced from Christian faith. The church's ethos is open hospitality embracing inter-faith and non-religious, while maintaining mutual respect with other church fellowships. The church's goal is to give room to all people to feel welcome and for our place to be your place.

BUILDING USE POLICY

The building is available to any who wish to book it, regardless of faith or no faith, on condition that no disrespect is shown for beliefs and values of the kaitiaki of the building.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Applications can be made to the parish council for the use of alcohol for appropriate events. It is decided case by case and moderation is essential.

FACILITIES

HALL - Seats 150-160, vinyl overlay flooring
WORSHIP AREA - seats 150-175, carpet flooring

HALL and WORSHIP AREA can be used together as one room. Hire of each or both at an hourly rate, full day rate (8 hours), and a small add-on for additional hours.

MEETING ROOM - seats 20-25, carpet flooring
CHILDREN'S ROOM - seats 15-20, carpet flooring

MEETING ROOM and CHILDREN'S ROOM have an hourly rate and a full day rate. IT/ data connections available in both of these rooms. A kitchenette is available with the hire of any areas, at no extra cost.

KITCHEN - a separate fee applies: equipped with commercial grade equipment to serve up to 200 people.

Guest Wi-fi available throughout the facility. AV equipment in Hall and Worship Area

Authorised maximum capacity for the whole facility: 250
